I was a young girl of about 12 years of age in the Fall of 1948 when Bro. William Branham passed through my home town of Dawson Creek, British Columbia, Canada. He was coming to hunt at the invitation of some local farmers, and agreed to have one service in the little local gospel church.

I had never heard his name but because I loved to go to church I was at the meeting, sitting in the back row. At the close of the service I began to leave through the double doors that led first to the small foyer where the coats were hanging. Because of the crowd I stepped behind the door and waited for the people to get their coats and then open the second set of doors and exit into the cool Fall evening.

Soon Bro. Branham appeared, making his way with the moving crowd. He stopped, turned and saw me behind the door and took my hand. I will never forget his words: "Little sister, if you will commit your way unto the Lord He will give you the desires of your heart."

I was immediately weeping. I knew at that moment that I was in the presence of a man who walked close to God. Something supernatural took place and I stood for a long time behind that door feeling wrapped in a cloud of peace and wonder that could not be explained.
